Our pupils enjoy both a nurturing environment and the social benefits of a small school and the range and resources of a large, well equipped academy.

Facilities

Our buildings were designed by award winning architects Studio E (who created the successful design for City of London Academy in Southwark) and are organised to support calm and ordered learning. Pupils have access to specialist indoor and outdoor sports facilities, excellent science and ICT facilities, music, design and technology, art and drama studios and a 150 sqm, well-stocked and up-to-date library as well as inviting and well-equipped classrooms

ARK Schools is an education charity set up in 2004 to create a network of high achieving, non-selective, inner city schools where all pupils, regardless of their background or prior attainment, achieve highly enough by age 18 to have real choices: to go on to university or the career of their choice. ARK Schools has no faith affiliations.

All the ARK schools are situated in areas of high deprivation or educational need and our pupil profile reflects this: over half of our pupils are eligible for free school meals compared to 18% nationally.

The ARK network operates 38 schools in the UK across London, Portsmouth, Birmingham and Hastings Each of our schools has its own distinctive character, reflecting its local community.

About the Design & Technology (DT) Department

The Art, Design and Technology faculty is a team of 5 teachers and is supported by 2 Technicians, across 5 modern and well-appointed studios.

We teach a wide base of Art, Design & Technology to all students in Yr7 to 9 and offer a Design and Technology course at GCSE.

As a department we aim to:

Job Description: Design & Technology Technician

Reporting to: Head of Faculty

Contract: Full Time / Term time + 2 weeks = 41 weeks per annum.

Salary: Scale 7

The Role

As DT technician, you will support teaching and learning by ensuring that workshops, classrooms and kitchen are fully prepared for all lessons and appropriate equipment is safely maintained and available for all lessons. The role will be focussed on all aspects of Design Technology and will include some food preparation. In addition to departmental organisation and resources preparation, the technician will support teachers in the classroom during practical lessons where directed, especially when machinery is used under health and safety guidelines.

Key Responsibilities

Teaching and Learning

- Prepare materials and equipment for lessons and projects, including preparation of demonstration materials and resources
- Ensure all students' work and unused material are returned to the appropriate storage area
- Ensure Kitchens are kept tidy and cloths and aprons are clean.
- Assist departmental staff in developing appropriate resources for teaching and learning, including preparation for exams
- Demonstrate methods and techniques to students during lessons, as requested by the appropriate member of staff and under their direction
- Support exhibitions and the curating of work for GCSE and A Level
- Supporting curriculum educational visits
- To help and support the extracurricular/ enrichment programme
- To provide technical assistance to pupils during lessons and private study sessions
- To be responsible for DT departmental displays and the preparation, mounting and installation of work around the School
- To support GCSE students with their coursework outside lesson times.

Equipment Maintenance

- Ensure each workshop including all machinery and equipment is maintained to a high standard, ensuring the safety and wellbeing of students and staff
- Ensure each teaching room is tidy, and free from all hazards, maintaining an
 effective learning environment
- Maintain stock rooms, keep stock records, and replenish equipment and materials and to review the inventories of resources
- Maintaining educational equipment with specialist knowledge and completing annual training which will be certified (laser cutter, pewter caster, vacuum former, etc)

 Maintaining and inspecting DT machinery (including table saw, band saw, belt sander, scroll saw, etc)

Health and Safety

- Ensure all statutory health and safety regulations are appropriately adhered to in the workshops, immediately alerting the Head of Faculty to any deficiencies
- Maintain and safely use machinery and equipment. Specialist training will be provided where required
- To complete documentation and maintain digital/physical records associated with technical services
- To be responsible to the Head of Faculty for health and safety matters and to carry out Risk and COSHH assessments as required by the Operations Manager.

Other

- First Aid provision as required training will be provided
- Carry out other reasonable tasks as directed by Line Manager

Disclosures This post is classified as having substantial access to children, and appointment is subject to an enhanced police check of previous criminal convictions (DBS). Applicants are required, before appointment, to disclose any conviction, caution or binding over including 'spent convictions' under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 (Exemptions) Order 1975. The probation period is a trial period, to enable the assessment of an employee's suitability for the job for which they have been employed. It provides the academy with the opportunity to monitor and review the performance of new staff in relation to various areas, but also in terms of their commitment to safeguarding and relationships with pupils.
