The Role

We are looking for a well-qualified teacher and Psychology Lead who is capable of delivering high quality A level lessons across both academies, and who shares our belief in the ability of all KS5 students to achieve outstanding academic progress. You will need to be adaptable and excited by both the prospect of working across two sites and the opportunity to play a role in building and strengthening our shared sixth form ethos.

Key Responsibilities

Leadership and Management

- Monitor, evaluate and continually improve the quality of planning, teaching, and assessment within the Psychology department
- Manage departmental budget and resources effectively and efficiently
- Lead behaviour management in the department, securing strong routines for learning, consistent with the academy's policy, and liaising with tutors and parents when necessary
- Develop strong partnerships and ensure regular communication with parents and carers

Improving Teaching & Learning

- Model outstanding teaching and lead collaborative planning and development, including the sharing of resources and best practice within the department
- Be responsible for tracking student progress across the faculty within both academies, analysing all relevant data to make data-driven changes to the curriculum design and intervention strategies and using the data to monitor the performance of subject staff
- Be accountable for student progress in psychology within both academies, ensuring that all students achieve results in line with, or better than, value-added predictions
- Monitor the work of the department through rigorous and regular lesson observations, work scrutinies, and provide detailed, constructive feedback
- Lead joint practice development across the faculty subject teams, ensuring that outstanding practice is shared with all staff in the faculty and the wider school, and work with other department heads to exploit cross-year and cross-curricular links



- Plan, deliver, monitor and evaluate the curriculum provision and enrichment within the department.
- Monitor the identification of and provision for students with individual needs, and develop differentiated learning and teaching methods and schemes of learning
- Implement and adhere to both academy's behaviour management policy, ensuring the health and well-being of pupils is maintained at all times
- Participate actively throughout the network, by attending relevant meetings, and, as appropriate, delivering network-wide training and initiatives
- Work with colleagues, students and families to develop a strong school community
