The Role

As Head of Year 7, you will be responsible for ensuring Ark Pioneer offers outstanding pastoral support for all year 7 pupils, fostering a culture that enables all pupils to maximise their achievements across the spectrum of school life. You will be instrumental in our mission to provide every pupil with real options when they leave school, be it to go onto their chosen career or a course of their choice in university.

Key Responsibilities

Leadership and Management

- Lead the management of all aspects of academy life for the year group
- Organise and, through a team of tutors, implement a framework for daily tutor activities, tasks and assemblies
- Lead, support and hold accountable a professional community of form tutors
- Regularly analyse pupils' pastoral data, reviewing behaviour, attendance and punctuality and take action to improve accordingly
- Be proactive in the social, emotional and academic wellbeing of pupils, in collaboration with other staff members and other external agencies, as appropriate

Culture and Ethos

- Set high standards for behaviour and explain clearly to parents and pupils how these standards are key in creating and sustaining an excellent school
- Contribute to the development of clear systems for behaviour that enable pupils to reflect on and learn from their mistakes and develop their ability to make good decisions
- Induct and practise pupils in routines for the school day so there is a positive climate for learning in every classroom and school is calm and orderly
- Facilitate a positive transition between primary & secondary school
- Foster a strong sense of school community and ethos among both staff and pupils
- Act as a positive role model to staff and pupils, communicating the highest expectations of behaviour, attendance and punctuality
- Establish positive working relationships with parents and carers of the year group and communicate regularly with them

Teaching Responsibilities

- Set high expectations so that all pupils are inspired, motivated and challenged to reach their full potential
- Create a positive climate for learning, by explicitly teaching lesson routines and applying behaviour systems consistently and fairly
- Plan and teach well-structured, differentiated lessons which allow adequate time to embed new knowledge, understanding and skills

- Nurture every pupil's intellectual curiosity, asking pertinent questions to deepen pupils' understanding
- Systematically check pupils' understanding and act to correct any misconceptions
- Provide pupils with individual feedback aimed at moving his or her learning forward, developing a
 growth mindset in each pupil
- Review and reflect on each assessment to identify gaps in pupil learning and take steps to address them
