


Ark John Keats Academy





Dear colleague,

Thank you for your interest in the role of Head of Primary at Ark John Keats Academy. Our school is an all-through academy, offering the opportunity for children to attend from age 3 in nursery all the way to age 18 in the sixth form. Our teachers and leaders are dedicated to helping our wonderful young people find success at every step of this special journey and beyond. We know that education has the power to shape and transform pupils' lives, and that transformation begins from the second they step through the doors of our primary school.

Ark John Keats is situated in Enfield, where historically educational outcomes have not reflected the incredible potential of young people here. Our first year 6 SATs results were 9% above national average, but this is a long way from what we aspire to achieve, and what our young people deserve to achieve. Our primary phase is critical to get children on the path to a life of real choice by empowering them with strong outcomes, as well as to imbue them with the wider personal development and enriching opportunities to enable them to access and enjoy all aspects of their future lives.

At Ark John Keats, you will work with a parent community who are ambitious and aspirational for their children. They are supportive of our aims and methods to ensure their children reach their highest potential. In joining a large all-through school, you will benefit from working with colleagues across the phases to develop our approaches and share practice. We also believe in a diverse, inclusive, and highly supportive working culture. For instance, at Ark John Keats we ensure staff are not emailed beyond 6pm and we have a weekly gratitude breakfast where we come together to share our appreciation of one another. In addition, you will benefit from a strong community of Primary Headteachers in the Ark network and other benefits such as having a one-to-one professional coach. We truly believe that every child has limitless potential. Our all-through nurture and care of all our young people means we have the benefit of being able to see the fruits of our efforts long after pupils leave the primary phase. As Head of Primary, you will shape that journey to ensure the curriculum is enriching, the teaching enables strong outcomes, and the environment facilitates high standards of pupil conduct.

As part of an all-through school this opportunity is well suited to first time heads who have strong and significant leadership experience. In addition, we also welcome experienced heads to apply; as a three-form entry school we offer significant scale and development for a serving head of a smaller primary school.

The role

Ark John Keats is looking to appoint an exceptional candidate to the post of Primary Headteacher.

This is an incredible opportunity to lead the school through the next stage of its development. Ark John Keats was founded in 2013 with one class of reception children. We are now a fully-fledged all-through school, running from nursery to year 13, with over 1700 children. Our primary school is three-form entry and is oversubscribed, with a waiting list for every year group. Our community is composed of supportive and committed families who buy into our vision and work with us to ensure their children achieve all they are capable of in the future.

Our long-term ambition is to take children from age 3 in our nursery to age 18, and our primary school will set our children up for a lifetime of success and opportunity. We aspire for all our children to have the academic knowledge necessary to enable them to progress to university, for pupils to have a love of learning and curiosity about the world, and for them to be polite, well-mannered young people who take responsibility for their choices and drive their own destinies.

Ark John Keats is part of Ark, a hugely successful network serving pupils from deprived communities. Our primary is one of Ark's 24 primary schools, and you will join a community of committed and driven headteachers who work closely together to share good practice, provide support for one another, and improve what we do as a school and a network.

We believe in rigour — our curriculum is full of challenge, and we know that our children are intellectually resilient and capable of learning lots in every subject no matter what their starting point.

We believe in exemplary behaviour — we have sky high standards and support all children to reach these, by focusing on developing pupils' self-regulation, explicitly teaching pupils how to behave, and by working closely with families.

We believe in an education that is genuinely from age 3 to 18 – the enormous benefit of an all-through school means we know our children far beyond the time they leave the primary and we can provide a joined-up curriculum all the way through, we have an aligned primary and secondary team, a shared outlook, and, most importantly, the ability to transform children's futures.

We believe in the limitless potential of all children — if children work hard, there are not limits to what they can achieve.

Job description

The Head of Primary is responsible for providing an outstanding education for all pupils at the primary. They will work with the senior team to establish outstanding teaching and learning and an excellent school culture.

Key responsibilities

- Leadership of the primary and its staff in order to achieve extremely high standards of teaching and learning, behaviour and attainment
- Implementation and coordination of the vision, ethos and strategy for the primary
- Leadership of effective external relationships, including the local community and other stakeholders
- Contribution to the overall direction of the Ark network.

Outcomes and activities

Personal leadership and coaching

- · Recruit, train, motivate and mentor all staff
- Instil an ethos of high expectations for achievement and behaviour for all pupils
- Lead the development of the primary and all-through academy curriculum and culture
- Maintain strong working relationships with the community, agencies, and stakeholders, including parents and the Governing Body.

Coordination of the overall strategy

- Oversee staffing allocation, including support staff, across the primary
- Coordinate cross-primary responsibilities among the senior leaders and staff
- Ensure robust operational systems are in place that support the primary's efficient functioning
- Working with the Finance and Operations team, oversee the primary finance, facilities, catering and resources across the school.

Development of the Ark network

- Collaborate with others in the network to develop good practice and share innovation
- Help shape or lead education initiatives across the Ark network
- Undertake any other responsibilities as directed by the all-through Principal.

Our school is built on the belief that all pupils can make exceptional progress and we are committed to supporting our pupils to become confident, articulate, culturally aware young adults. Our curriculum is a mastery curriculum, planned backwards from university level study and designed to develop a framework of knowledge and understanding in each subject area that provides a solid foundation for further study.

We have a structured approach to developing self-discipline and character to support academic achievement, create thoughtful citizens and allow our pupils to make reflective choices over their personal lives. We ensure pupils develop wider interests and passions through an in-day enrichment programme with activities ranging from chess and coding to football and political art. We have the highest aspirations for our pupils and support them to explore their thinking about the future through university and workplace visits and through our Digest speaker programme, where visitors speak to pupils about their career choices and educational experiences.

Our teaching staff are experts in their subject areas and all staff at the academy share a commitment to the highest expectations. We dedicate a significant amount of time to staff development through weekly whole school CPD, collaborative curriculum planning time built into the timetable and weekly coaching for staff at all stages of their career.

Ark's Six Pillars













1. High Expectations

We believe that every child can achieve great things. So we set high expectations for all our pupils, and we do whatever it takes to meet them. Our aspirations are no lower for our most vulnerable pupils.

2. Excellent Teaching

A teacher affects a pupil's achievement more than any other factor. We work side-by-side with teaching staff, supporting them with training and development so that they can deliver excellent teaching. To make sure that no pupil is left behind, we've developed data management tools which help teachers to monitor progress — this shows when pupils, or indeed teaching staff, need extra support.

3. Knowing Every Child

We organise our schools so that every child knows, and is known well by, every adult in the school. We also recognise that children do best when families and schools work together. We keep parents well informed about children's targets, and we involve families in all aspects of school life. To nurture a love of reading and develop fluent communication skills, we also dedicate more time to literacy and English. We make sure that all of our teachers recognise the barriers that children face in building literacy skills, and we offer tools and expertise to enable teachers to best support students who need more help.

4. Depth for Breadth

When children build firm foundations in English, maths and other key subjects, they find it easier to do well in other subjects too. That's why we prioritise depth in these subjects, giving our pupils the best chance of success. We've developed *Ark Curriculum Plus* which aims to improve attainment, enjoyment and confidence in key subjects. Their approach is based on tried and tested methods from around the world, and is endorsed by Ofsted. Ark Curriculum Plus has over 1000 Mastery programmes being used across the country in Mathematics, English, Science, History and Geography across primary and secondary schools.

5. Exemplary Behaviour

Our schools are characterised by a respectful environment, where teachers can focus on teaching and pupils can focus on learning. We teach, recognise and reinforce good behaviour, and we don't tolerate poor behaviour. We don't accept any excuses, and we don't make any either.

6. Always Learning

To make sure children have enough time both for core subjects and for extra-curricular activities, many of our schools run a longer school day. Others are open at weekends and during school holidays, offering masterclasses and revision sessions. Many Ark schools offer residential stays, day trips and summer schools. In every school, no time is wasted — every hour of every day is devoted to children learning.
